



Dear Fellow Horsemen,

For the past several years I have been working with the **Equitarian Initiative**, a charity organization that provides veterinary care to working equids (horses, mules and donkeys) in underserved communities in developing countries. In the past 3 years, I have been fortunate to have been able to volunteer my time on projects in Mexico, Peru, Nicaragua and Costa Rica. These projects have aided thousands of animals and their families. In order for this work to continue, I am reaching out to you and our local horse community for your support.



There are an estimated **100 million plus working equids** in the world that approximately **6.5 million people** are economically reliant on.



It is estimated that these animals represent **90%** of the world's horses but are **serviced by less than 1%** of the world's veterinarians.

According to one United Nations study, having a donkey represented an increase in annual income to a family of \$500 in areas where average yearly household income was \$2500.

I have just returned from phase one of a new project in Costa Rica. This project is in conjunction with **World Horse Welfare** and **Costa Rica Equine Welfare** with the people in the Ngabe (Guaymi) Indigenous Reserve. We are providing routine veterinary care including vaccinations, internal and external parasite control, wound care, castrations, dental care and other needed veterinary services. We are also using these projects as teaching opportunities for American as well as local veterinary students. We treated 160 horses in June and are returning in January with expectations to treat up to 650 animals.
