Do you know what that means?" The 3rd and 4th place ribbons had been awarded and all that remained were Kathy and me. At this moment, I had already won no matter what the final result was, because I already had accomplished my goal of making it to the top 4. As I returned back to the ring for the awards ceremony, Kathy and I held hands, in support of one another, walking proudly to the lineup for awards.

The CPHA Foundation Final has been a goal of mine since I began competing in the equitation with my horse Diego Garcia in 2012. Due to health challenges, I had to take a five-year hiatus and returned to competing in 2021 with my new mount, Il Divo.
