



## 2026 CPHA Style of Riding Jumper Equitation Class (Qualifying Class)

### Eligibility:

- The CPHA Style of Riding Jumper Class is open to all Jr/Am riders who are current members of the CPHA, and whose trainers are current members of the CPHA.
- For the class to count, at least 3 riders must complete the course.
- Riders **MAY** continue to ride in this class to accumulate points for the CPHA Style of Riding Year End Award.
- This is a jumper seat equitation medal class scored as a Table II, 2b format jumper class.
- When there is an equality of jumping/time faults then the judge's subjective style of riding score will break the tie.
- A rider must have no jumping, or time, faults as well as a judge's score of 75 or better to compete in the jump-off round.
- The time allowed must be monitored by the judge for the first three riders that complete the course successfully and adjusted if the judge deems necessary.
- The first 3 riders may continue to the jump-off even if they have up to 5 time faults, as long as they have a score of 75 or above and no jumping faults. After the judge confirms the time-allowed, the first 3 riders' round 1 times will be re-evaluated. Only if they are within the confirmed time allowed will their jump-off will be counted.

### Class Conditions:

- This class is a jumper seat equitation class held in the jumper ring over a course of fences set at 1.00m in height with spreads to 1.15m, in a Table II, 2b format.
- The course must contain a triple or two double combinations and a **Liverpool**.
- Liverpool may not be used in a combination.
- The course should be of the type used in a Children/Adult Jumper class.
- Time allowed will be calculated at 350 meters per minute.
- A jumper type horse and conventional jumper equipment will not be penalized.
- Standing and running martingales ARE permitted.
- Draw reins and German martingales are NOT permitted.

**Judging:**

- The class will be judged under a modified Table II, 2b format with jumping and time faults being calculated.
- The judge's equitation score is used to break the tie for the riders who have an equality of jumping and/or time faults.
- At the completion of the first round all riders with CLEAR rounds (no jumping or time faults) **AND** a total score of 75 or better will immediately (after the tone) complete the jump off/work off shortened course.
- If early riders have time faults but no jumping faults, and a score over 75, they may proceed to the jump off while the time allowed is being monitored.
- The jump off/work off is judged in the same manner as the first round, with an emphasis placed on an efficient time saving track. The judge's subjective equitation score from the jump-off is **ADDED** to the first-round equitation score, and the rider with the highest cumulative score **and** the fewest number of faults is the winner. The judge's equitation scores from both rounds should be used to rank riders with an equal number of faults so that there are no ties.
- Two refusals will incur elimination.
- The open numerical scoring system will be used. Jumping/time faults and the judge's equitation score will be announced after each round. There is no need to deduct the time and jumping faults from the numerical score.
- The remaining placings for the class (competitors not participating in the jump off), will be determined by the rider with the fewest number of faults and the highest judge's score. (Basically, scored as a jumper class, but the judge's score, instead of the time will break the tie when there in an equality of faults.)

**Year End Awards and Championships:**

- Points will be awarded in classes as follows: 6, 4, 3, 2, 1.
- Placings go to 5<sup>th</sup>.

- Three competitors must complete the course to receive points.
- The points go towards a year end high point award, which will be given at the annual CPHA year-end banquet.
- There will be two Style of Riding Championship classes held, one in the South and one in the North.
- To be eligible for the Championship an exhibitor must have ridden in at least one class prior to the championship of the current show year.

**Any class with 30 or more riders must be split (California split) with two sets of awards and two sets of ribbons to be distributed.**

***Trainers and riders must be members of the CPHA prior to riding in this class.***
